CHINESE CHICKEN SALAD

Yield: 10-12 servings

Ingredients: SALAD:

2 pounds chicken, cooked and chopped 1 head cabbage, shredded 4 green onions, chopped 1 package Chicken or



- 1 package Chicken or Oriental Ramen noodles (3 oz.)
- 2 ounces sesame seeds (or use sunflower seeds)
- 4 ounces slivered almonds
- 1/2 teaspoon cooking oil

DRESSING:

- 1/4 cup granulated sugar1/4 cup oil6 tablespoons cider or rice vinegar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 teaspoon pepper
- 1/2 teaspoon reduced-sodium soy sauce
- Ramen seasoning packet



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INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Crush or break apart the Ramen noodles and reserve the seasoning packet for the salad dressing.

Heat the 1/2 teaspoon oil in a skillet on medium-high heat, toast the seeds and almonds until lightly browned.
In a large bowl, combine the chopped chicken, shredded cabbage, green onions, noodle pieces, seeds, and almonds.

4. In a small or medium bowl, whisk together the dressing ingredients. Pour the dressing over the salad and stir to coat. Serve as a main dish or side dish.

The OBX Paddlers Club is holding its annual picnic on June 25 at the Old Swimming Hole near the Manteo Airport. Please join us if you are interested in kayaking and meeting fellow paddlers. We will launch our kayaks from the waterfront park by the clubhouse at 1:00 PM, followed by our covered dish dinner and barbecue at the pavilion, beginning at 3:00 PM. Bring food to share and a beverage of your choice.

The Paddlers Club has been active in Dare County since the early 1990s, and currently has about 100 members. This year, we are planning an active schedule that includes scenic excursions on mainland rivers, as well as regular paddles in our local bays and sounds.

On alternating Thursday evenings, we plan to launch from one of two sites: downtown Manteo, or near the bridge on Colington Road. Each location provides excellent protection from wind, beautiful scenery, and a restaurant where we can finish off the evening with a bite to eat. Sometimes we will take a leisurely paddle, but other times we will be practicing paddling skills, including bracing, wet exits and re-entries. We always wear life jackets.

On Saturdays, we are planning open water exercise paddles for members seeking a vigorous workout. Open water on the sound can involve significant wind and chop, and these paddles are intended for folks with the skills and fitness to take on these challenges. It is particularly important to come to these paddles with the necessary equipment, including a spray skirt.





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2016 BANNER YEAR FOR US HOUSING MARKETS

The tide has turned, and according to Freddie Mac, this year is shaping up to be the best year for the housing market since 2006. Home sales, new construction and house prices are set to reach decade-level highs. The main reasons for this forecast are low mortgage rates, an improving job market, and an increase in housing supply.

Since the start of 2016, mortgage rates have remained below 4 percent. Freddie Mac's monthly Outlook for March forecasts that we can expect the

30 year mortgage rates to remain attractive through the spring home-buying season. Rates are expected to stay below 4 percent until the second half of the year.

Gains in employment will aid the housing market as well. The resilient U.S. labor market has been producing 205,000 net job gains per month since 2011. Unemployment is now down below 5 percent, although wage growth remains slow, barely keeping up with inflation. Wage growth will be a key factor for the near future housing markets. If wages and incomes don't begin to rise, then home prices, rents, and rising interest rates will squeeze households and ultimately slow the current momentum.

Despite some challenges, the "nation's housing markets should sustain their momentum from 2015 into 2016 and 2017. "Housing markets are poised for their best year in a decade," says Sean Becketti, Freddie Mac's chief economist. In our latest forecast, total home sales, housing starts, and home prices will reach their highest levels since 2006."
